



Sailors and Firemen to mutually assist each other in the duties of the ship. Firemen to keep the galley supplied with coal. Crew to work coal cargo or ballast if required. No cash or liberty granted other than at the pleasure of the Master. Each member of the crew must return all linen, bed, bedding and other utensils to the Steward before leaving; all shortages will be charged for in account of wages at current prices. The Master shall be at liberty (subject to compliance with statutory requirements) to discharge any member of the crew at any time for neglect, misconduct or incompetence. Any member of the crew ashore without leave, a substitute may be engaged and the same charged in seaman's account of wages. No intoxicating liquor to be brought on board.

Crew to work winches when and wherever necessary, either loading or discharging.

- 3. In the event of Contraband Goods being found secreted on board for the purpose of sminggling, the Crew hereby agree that any fine imposed by the Customs shall be deducted from their wages. If no owner be found, the said fine to be deducted either from the wages of that portion of the crew belonging to the Department in which the Contraband Goods shall have been discovered or from the whole of the Crew.
- 4. It is strictly forbidden for any member of the crew to aid, abet, assist and/or smuggle in any manner whatsoever another person to become or attempt to become a stowaway. From now on anyone found aiding, abetting, assisting and/or smuggling any person to stow away on our vessels will be arrested and prosecuted and the maximum penalty will be asked for.
- Smoking and the use of naked lights only allowed in such places as designated by the Master.
- In the event of the ship being lost through stress of weather, Sec. 199-286 of the C.S.A. with recard to wages and proper return port to apply.
- In the event of the ship being lost through enemy Action, Order in Council
  of November 10th, 1940, P.C. 3358-3359 with regard to loss of effects, pension
  award, etc., and proper return port to apply.
- 8. Overtime Rates. The hours of labour of deck and engine room ratings at sea shall be eight hours per day exclusive of emergency duties of which the Master shall be the sole judge. On Sundays or Canadian statutory holidays the men shall be free from duty except that necessary for the navigation of the ship, the safety of the ship, sounding, washing of decks, before 8 a.m., and supplying steam for any purpose.

The hours of labour in port shall be eight per day Mondays to Fridays inclusive and four on Saturdays.

The hours of labour of the catering staff at sea and in port shall be eight per day in a spread of 12 hours Sundays included.

Subject to the foregoing, overtime at sea, as under, will be paid deck and engine ratings for any work done in excess of eight hours per day.

Overtime in port, as under, will be paid for any work done in excess of eight hours per day, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, Saturday afternoons, Sundays and Canadian Statutory holidays:

Carpenter, Bosun, Donkeyman, Chief Steward, Chief Cook.
Ablescamen, Oilers, Firemen, Trimmers, 2nd Cook, 2nd Steward,
Messmen
Ordinary Seamen, Deck Boys, Galley Boys, United Boys.

9. Unconsumed Provisions. All stores and provisions issued to the crew are only for use and consumption on board the ship, and the property in any unused or unconsumed stores or provisions remains in the Shipowner.

Any member of the crew taking ashore, selling, destroying or giving away any such stores or provisions renders himself liable to prosecution.
